## Public Comments

Ben Goff, Harriett's Bluff

Mr. Goff entered the following comment for the record:

I remember vividly taking issue with ROW mowing in 2014, and was assured by our commissioner for district 2 that improvement was coming.

I also remember emailing him later in the year that the best work that I had seen was now being accomplished.

Culverts and signs bridge crossings were being cut with weed eaters and there was a general vast improvement over the previous contractors that would bring "bat wing" mowers into the subdivisions.

I had no further concerns with ROW mowing and trash pickup for a couple of years.

I had no reason to suspect that the original contract for \$139,000 dollars annually had increased to more than \$240,000 dollars per year, but it in fact had.

The actual improvement slowly began to deteriorate and more efficient ways to kill vegetation around culverts were discovered, creating failing culvert shoulders, and apparently all of the weed eaters died and were not replaced because I have not seen any until very recently when a couple of bridges were trimmed with those devices. I think that may have been caused by the state highway department?

The contract signed by the PSA and the county has very specific guidelines as to how the work was to be completed, with specific requirements for "monitoring that work".

Not only has the work not been completed as detailed, on an ongoing basis, it has gotten worse. From a citizens perspective, not only has the contractor not fulfilled terms of the contract on an ongoing basis, neither has the entity that is supposed to be monitoring the work of the contractor.

Checks to the PSA have been sent regularly for substandard work, especially on Harriett's Bluff road and the subdivisions that are supposed to be maintained.

I believe that that the contract with PSA expired more than a year ago and it stated in the contract that the term would not exceed 5 years total, thus the contract expired in April of 2019. Work has been extended twice since that time. Performance hasn't improved...Where is the supervision?

The language and terms of the contract seem to be very appropriate, and if followed would more than suffice. Where is the supervision?

Vice-Chairman Blount made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Brant to adjourn the Regular Meeting and convene a Public Hearing at 6:23 PM.

**RESOLUTION  
DECLARING CAMDEN COUNTY, GEORGIA  
A SECOND AMENDMENT SANCTUARY COUNTY**

**Whereas**, The Second Amendment of the Constitution of the United States of America reads: "A well-regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.";

**Whereas**, Article 1, Section 1, Paragraph VIII of the Constitution of the State of Georgia reads: "Arms, right to keep and bear. The right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed, but the General Assembly shall have power to prescribe the manner in which arms may be borne.";

**Whereas**, certain legislation such as SB 281 has been filed for the 2020 session in the Georgia General Assembly, and certain -legislation introduced in the current session of the United States Congress could have the effect of infringing on the rights of law abiding citizens to keep and bear arms as guaranteed by the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution;

**Whereas**, the Camden County Board of Commissioners is concerned about the passage of any bill containing language which could be interpreted as infringing upon the constitutional right of the citizens of Camden County to keep and bear arms or could lead to further restrictions of the Second Amendment right of the citizens of Camden County;

**Whereas**, the Camden County Board of Commissioners intends to uphold its commitment to defending the right of Camden County citizens to keep and bear arms granted to them by the United States Constitution; and

**Whereas**, the Camden County Board of Commissioners wish to declare Camden County as a Sanctuary County for the Second Amendment right guaranteed to all Americans and to oppose, within the limits of the United States Constitution and the laws of the State of Georgia, any efforts to unconstitutionally restrict such rights, and to use any legal means at the Board's disposal to protect the inalienable rights of the citizens of Camden County, Georgia to keep and bear arms not limited to initiating legal action, petitioning for a redress of grievances, and not enforcing any law deemed unconstitutional;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF CAMDEN COUNTY, GEORGIA:**

1. Camden County is hereby declared a Second Amendment Sanctuary County, wherein the right of law abiding citizens to keep and bear arms for the purpose of lawful self-defense, community defense, sport shooting, game hunting, and gun collecting as protected by the United States and Georgia Constitutions, is engrained in the very being of our community since before the founding of our Republic and must be respected, celebrated, and upheld;

2. Camden County urges the General Assembly, the United States Congress, and other State and Federal government agencies to refuse to adopt, accept, or enact any provision, law, or regulation that may infringe, deny, or place any undue burden on the right of law abiding citizens to keep and bear arms; and,
3. Camden County expresses its intent to continue to take lawful actions to protect and support the inalienable right of its citizens to keep and bear arms as guaranteed by the United States and Georgia Constitutions, and to refuse to aid in unconstitutional efforts to restrict these rights;
4. Camden County opposes, in particular, any provision, law, or regulation that imposes any burden on its citizens right to keep and bear arms as well as any mandate to expand public funds for enforcement or administration of such laws, or to require constitutional officers of the locality to do so;
5. The Camden County Administrator is directed to forward true and exact copies of this resolution to the County's representatives in the General Assembly, the United States Congress, The Governor of Georgia, and to the Sheriff of Camden County, Georgia; and,
6. This resolution is effective immediately upon adoption by the Camden County Board of Commissioners.

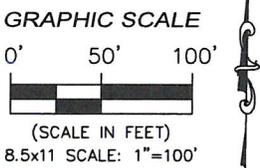
