



## **Public Notice: Camden County Residents Encouraged to Monitor Tropical Storm Isaias**

Camden County Emergency Management Agency (EMA) is carefully monitoring the still-changing track of Tropical Storm Isaias for impacts to Camden County. All citizens are encouraged to remain actively engaged by following Camden County EMA for updates regarding the storm. The details of the storm's forecast are changing and at this time it is still too soon to determine the magnitude and location of potential impacts.

Local residents are also encouraged to visit the National Hurricane Center, [www.nhc.noaa.gov](http://www.nhc.noaa.gov), and the National Weather Service Office in Jacksonville, [www.weather.gov/jax](http://www.weather.gov/jax), as trusted sites for weather related information. In addition, Camden County residents are urged to sign-up for the CodeRED Emergency Notification System by visiting [www.camdencountyga.gov/CodeRED](http://www.camdencountyga.gov/CodeRED) or texting "CamdenCodeRED" to 99411. CodeRED is critical during situations like this as a direct method of communication from Camden County EMA to your landline, cell phone, or email. TDD/TTY service is also available. Participants will be notified in the event of emergency situations or critical community alerts.

Camden County residents living in low lying or flood prone areas are strongly urged to monitor the forecast for changing conditions.

Camden County Emergency Management Agency (EMA), the Camden County Sheriff's Office, and in partnership with the cities of Kingsland, St. Marys, and Woodbine, along with Camden County Schools, Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay, and the National Weather Service (NWS) will coordinate incident response and public communications.
