



Public Notice: Impacts Unlikely from Tropical Storm Laura

As the forecasted track for Tropical Storm Laura continues to shift westward, it is unlikely to have significant impacts on Camden County. With Laura's current forecast, the greatest threat locally is for a higher risk of rip currents. Local officials, as part of the Executive Policy Group, working with the Camden County Emergency Management Agency continue to monitor tropical activity.

Camden County citizens are urged to take time now, while a storm is not threatening our community, to prepare for possible tropical activity. This hurricane season continues to be very active and we have yet to reach the busiest part of the season.
